Important Insurance Info for 2024 - Action Rquired

Valued Client & Guardians,

As we approach the new year, we wanted to remind you that Autism ETC must always maintain accurate insurance information on file for your child. Many employers change carriers for the new year. Our services require prior authorization from your insurance company. Therefore, if we do not have updated insurance information in advance of any change, we will not be able to obtain authorization for your child's services, and you could be personally responsible for payment.

We will soon be sending home an insurance verification form. <u>You must complete the form and return it to</u> <u>Autism ETC, even if your insurance has not changed.</u> Please be on the lookout for this form to be handed to you when you drop off your child. Ideally, we would like the form returned to us that same day. If you have any questions or concerns, please call me personally at 615-376-0034, option 5.

- Families with children with a severe or developmental disability, school age and younger;
- Adults with a severe or developmental disability who choose to live with their families; and
- Adults with a severe or developmental disability who reside in the community in an unsupported setting.
